1. Income Misrepresentation — Three Different Numbers in Three Filings

What [Petitioner] Declared in Financial Affidavit #1:

"My gross annual income is approximately \$62,000 per year from my employment at [Employer]."

What [Petitioner] Declared in Financial Affidavit #2 (5 months later):

"My current gross annual income is \$84,500."

What [Petitioner] Testified Under Oath:

"I make roughly \$55,000 a year. That is all I bring home."

What the Evidence Shows:

Bank statements obtained during discovery show total deposits of \$118,247 over the preceding 12 months. This includes regular biweekly deposits consistent with employment plus irregular deposits averaging \$4,200/month from an undisclosed source.

CaseBrake Finding: [Petitioner] provided three different income figures across two sworn affidavits and one hearing — \$62,000, \$84,500, and \$55,000 — none of which match the \$118,247 in documented deposits. The undisclosed deposits suggest unreported income. All affidavits were signed under penalty of perjury.

2. Mother's Mental Health — Fabricated Claims vs. Medical Records

What [Petitioner] Alleged in Emergency Motion:

"[Respondent] has been hospitalized for psychiatric episodes on multiple occasions and is currently not taking prescribed medication, making her a danger to the children."

What [Petitioner] Testified:

"She was hospitalized at least twice that I know of. The children were present during one of these episodes."

What the Medical Records Show:

[Respondent]'s complete medical records from the cited hospital system show zero psychiatric admissions. The only hospital visit was a single ER visit for a broken wrist sustained at work. No psychiatric holds, no medication history for psychiatric conditions.

What [Respondent]'s Therapist Confirmed:

A letter from [Respondent]'s licensed therapist states she has attended voluntary weekly counseling for stress management related to the divorce. No diagnoses. No medications. No hospitalizations. The therapist described her as 'a devoted and emotionally stable parent.'

CaseBrake Finding: [Petitioner] alleged 'multiple psychiatric hospitalizations' in a sworn emergency motion and under oath. Certified medical records show zero psychiatric admissions. This fabricated claim resulted in a temporary custody modification that separated [Respondent] from the children for seven weeks.

3. Living Situation — Claimed Solo Residence, Lease Shows Otherwise

What [Petitioner] Testified:

"I live alone in a two-bedroom apartment. The second bedroom is set up for the children."

What the Lease Shows:

The lease agreement lists two tenants: [Petitioner] and [Third Party]. Signed three months before the hearing.

CaseBrake Finding: [Petitioner] testified under oath that he lived alone. The lease and social media evidence show a cohabitant was present throughout. This is relevant because the court specifically asked about household composition during the parenting assessment.

4. Criminal History — Omitted From Disclosures

What [Petitioner] Disclosed:

Checked "No" on the Parenting Plan Disclosure form under "Criminal Convictions or Pending Charges."

What the Background Check Revealed:
